Secretary of Energy Hazel O'Leary has announced a new approach to openness in the Department of Energy (DOE) and its communications with the public. In support of this initiative, we are pleased to forward the enclosed information related to the former Gardinier, Inc. site in your jurisdiction that performed work for DOE's predecessor agencies. This information is provided for your information, use, and retention

DOE's Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program is responsible for identification of sites used by DOE's predecessor agencies, determining their current radiological condition and, where it has authority, performing remedial action to cleanup sites to meet current radiological protection requirements. A conservative set of technical evaluation guidelines is used in these investigations to assure protection of public health, safety and the environment. Where DOE does not have authority for proceeding, the available site information is forwarded to the appropriate Federal or State Agency.

DOE studied the historical records of the former Gardinier, Inc. site, and it determined that it did not have the authority to perform remedial action at the site. This site conducted various activities to concentrate the uranium that naturally occurs in phosphate rocks and chemicals.
