At the request of the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) performed a radiological survey of the Jessop Steel Company's facilities in Washington, Pennsylvania. The survey was performed because the Jessop facility had been used in the past to provide services to the Atomic Energy Commission, one of DOE's predecessors. I am enclosing three copies of the ORNL report, entitled <u>Results of the Radiological Survey at the Jessop Steel Company Site, 500 Green Street, Washington, Pennsylvania (JSP001). Since materials from the Jessop Site may have been relocated to a residence, the survey also included some portions of the residence. This report will be furnished to the owner of the residence.</u>

The survey found that the radiation levels and measured radioactivity are not significantly different from normal background levels in Pennsylvania. Since no radioactivity relating to DOE's predecessor was found during the survey, DOE will eliminate your company's facility from further consideration in its Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP).
