Dear Sir or Madam:

I am sending you this letter and the enclosed information as you have been identified by L. I. Trinin of Glick Construction Company as the representatives of the owners of the property that was formerly the site of the Sylvania-Corning Nuclear Corporation in Bayside, New York. The Department of Energy is evaluating the radiological condition of sites that were utilized under the Manhattan Engineer District and/or the Atomic Energy Commission in the early years of nuclear energy development to determine whether they need remedial action and whether the Department has authority to perform such action. As you may know, the former Sylvania-Corning Corporation Bayside site was identified as one such site. The corporation conducted research and development work for the Atomic Energy Commission from the late 1940's to the early 1960's.

As indicated in the enclosed preliminary survey report and site summary report, no residual radioactivity from these operations were identified by the Department's investigations. Additional investigations and monitoring conducted by the City of New York further confirmed these findings. As a result, the site has been eliminated from consideration for inclusion in the Department's Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program. The State of New York is being notified of this action by copy of this letter.
