II OPERATIONS:

An additional fifty tons of cast iron acrap were sold to Schreck's Scrap Service Inc. for \$32.00 per ton, the same price received for the original fifty-five tons awarded to them as a result of the public sale held April 7th.

Two carloads of conteminated scrap were monitored, loaded and shipped to Dismond Magnesium Co.

An Army bulldozer was used to dig a trench 100' long x.6' deep x 6' wide in which contaminated scrap metals, asbestos, cement and floor sweepings were buried. This trench is located approximately thirty feet north of "M" Street east of the storage building containing contaminated waste from the Schenectudy Operations Office.

750 scrap railroad ties from the abandoned Bell-spur line and scrap wooden bins from Building 717 were donated to and removed by the Army.

The Security Officer at LOSA performed an inspection of the fence from the West Patrol Road gate to the end of Castle Garden Road on foot and determined that the fence was in good order.

Mr. J. S. Quidor, NYO Administrative Director, visited LOSA on April 22 and 23 to review progress of the Surplus Materials & Equipment Disposal Program.

A second employee who had received an R.I.F. notice on April 13 resigned effective c.o.t. April 24.

One carload of ore was imported from Fldorado for Mallinckrodt and one radium source was imported for Los Alamos. Two survey meters were exported to Eldorado for NYOO and three shipments from Chalk River were cleared for Oak Ridge.
