## Salamander Meander

Silent and secretive, mole salamanders are largely creatures of mystery and are more abundant than most people realize. Many spend most of their life hidden under forest soils and leaf litter. But this time of year they migrate to wetlands where they will mate and lay eggs. Join us as we venture out under the light of a full moon in search of salamanders! Program begins with a brief indoor orientation.
