## **Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study, & Proposed Plan and the Administrative Record File for the Former Bliss & Laughlin Site Released for Formal Comment**

**September 28 through October 28, 1998**

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) has issued the Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study, & Proposed Plan and the Administrative Record File for the Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP) Former Bliss & Laughlin Site for public comment. This document has been placed in the Administrative Record File in the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library, Dudley Branch located at 2010 South Park Avenue in Buffalo, New York, and the USACE FUSRAP Public Information Center located at 1776 Niagara Street in Buffalo, New York.

USACE is preparing to conduct a cleanup action at the FUSRAP Former Bliss & Laughlin Site located at 110 Hopkins Street in Buffalo, New York.

The Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study, & Proposed Plan has been prepared to support these cleanup measures. The report summarizes the site characterization, evaluates cleanup alternatives, and identifies the preferred alternative.

The preferred alternative is decontamination and offsite disposal of low-level radioactive material. The preferred alternative will present no unacceptable risk to either workers or the general public, and can be implemented in a timely and cost-effective manner.

The Administrative Record File has been established at the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library, Dudley Branch located at 2010 South Park Avenue in Buffalo, New York and the USACE FUSRAP Public Information Center at 1776 Niagara Street, Buffalo, New York. Its purpose is to provide the public access to site-related information so that they may make informed comments on the selection of a remedy.

This notice establishes a 30-day public comment period for the Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study, & Proposed Plan and the Administrative Record File beginning September 28 and ending October 28. A public meeting will be held upon timely request. Written comments will be accepted anytime during this comment period. Written comments will be accepted if postmarked by October 28, 1998, at the following address:
