Dear Mr. Schaus:

This letter is being sent to urge you to reconsider allowing the US Department of Energy's (DOE) Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP) to remove the residual radioactive material at the former Bliss and Laughlin site. The NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) recommends you schedule the removal of the material as soon as possible since DOE budget cuts may severely restrict ' ture FUSRAP cleanup activities.

The factors supporting this recommendation are as follows:

- 1. The FFY '97 funding for the FUSRAP program has not been approved by Congress yet, and FFY '98 FUSRAP funding submitted for approval to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) is less than DOE Work Plan projections.
- 2. The slowdown of FUSRAP funding will extend fixed costs for the rest of the FUSRAP sites over a longer period of time, allowing even less of the available funds to be spent on remediation activities.

There are presently several radioactive waste disposal sites able to accept radioactive material from the cleanup of the Bliss and Laughlin site. However, their future availability is uncertain. Delay in this remedial action could result in unnecessary human exposures to ionizing radiation.
