


Per your request as indicated in your 8 October 2004 letter and telephone conversations between myself and of your staff, I am reiterating the department's position as set forth in our 20 September 2004 letter. ODH has committed to the Army Corps of Engineers that we will not pursue licensure of FUSRAP sites. It is the intent of the department to review the issue of licensure upon the completion of activities by the Army Corps of Engineers at each of the FUSRAP sites. At that time, the department will determine whether the site meets the state clean up criteria as set forth in the Ohio Revised Code. If not, we will pursue licensure of the site with the site owner for the purpose of achieving compliance with the established site criteria.

We look forward to continuing our relationship with the Corps for the review of site specific issues. Additionally, ODH supports the timely clean up of all the FUSRAP sites in the state of Ohio.
