Kassmin Williams - the new reporter for the Attleboro Sun Chronicle

is looking for your contact information.

She wants to get your reaction to EndCap's proposal to cap the Phase B portion of ALI.

She may have already gotten your number from Town Hall...

But I did not want for you to be getting a call from a reporter without a heads-up background brief.

In my comment pieces to MassDEP on the EndCap Proposal, I have hammered away at the potential conflict with cleanup of the Shpack FUSRAP Superfund Site.

There is the very real short term conflict (now a concern for US EPA and the PRP Group) of insufficient width on Union Rd. for trucks to travel in both directions.

Of greater concern is potential long term impacts from piling up excessive amounts of contaminated materials (One Million Two Hundred Thousand Tons)

creating another Mound of similar elevation attached to the ALI Phase A Mound (where there already is leaching into the Shpack Site).

In their August 17, 2012 comment letter to MassDEP, the Norton Board of Selectmen stated that: 'Prior to any approval for work at the Attleboro Landfill, we request that DEP seek written response from all parties involved with the Shpack cleanup.

We want complete assurance from the engineers involved in this \$70.5 million dollar

Superfund cleanup, that the integrity of the site will not be compromised by any work at the Attleboro Landfill.'

The easy answer is: Because the Attleboro Landfill abuts the Shpack FUSRAP/Superfund Site, Engineers at the Army Corps look forward to receiving and reviewing any construction plans for ALL.

Round and round and round we go. Must put an end to this nonsense soon.
