EndCap Attorney Richard Nylén: 'We didn't have any interest in continuing to spend money on that project at this time' - typically evasive to save face.

His comment that EndCap decided to withdraw because there was "no support" from the communities - a gross understatement. But he went on to say: 'and because there are no imminent environmental hazards presented by the uncapped dump'. Nylén finally told the truth and hit the nail square on the head. Hard as I tried to get that point across, the media continued to report that residents were more at risk if the site was left as is, than if EndCap proceeded with their plan.

I am fairly confident they will not be back. But also pretty sure that Dumont will find someone else, with some other scheme to bail him out. We shall see...

Not too many folks reading my e-mails the weekend before or Christmas Eve Day, but it was with a great sense of relief and satisfaction that I could put my ALI Files into the Inactive Attic Box! Merry Christmas.
