Consent Decree is Signed!

- 14 Potentially Responsible Parties (PRPs) signed the Consent Decree (CD):
 - Texas Instruments Incorporated;
 - City of Attleboro, Massachusetts;
 - Avnet, Inc.;
 - Bank of America, N. A., Trustee u/w of Lloyd G. Balfour;
 - BASF Catalysts LLC (f/k/a Englehard Corporation)
 - Chevron Environmental Management Company for itself and on behalf of Kewanee Industries, Inc;
 - ConocoPhillips Company;
 - Handy &Harman;
 - International Paper Company;
 - KIK Custom Products, Inc. (f/k/a CCLCustom Manufacturing, Inc.);
 - Swank, Inc.;
 - Teknor Apex Co;
 - Waste Management of Massachusetts, Inc.; and
 - Town of Norton, Massachusetts
- Department of Energy (DOE) also signed the CD (Settling Federal Agency)



Consent Decree (CD)

- Signed on September 11, 2008
- Lodged on December 9,2008
 - Notice published in federal register
 - Lodging started 30 day public comment period
- Entered in Court January 27, 2009
- CD is for chemical cleanup portion of the remedy



Record of Decision (ROD)

- ROD was signed September 30, 2004
- Section "L" of ROD describes the Selected Remedy for the Site and sets Performance Standards (Cleanup Levels) for soil and sediment excavations
- ROD also describes the Applicable or Relevant and Appropriate Requirements (ARARs) of Federal and State environmental laws that must be complied with
- Estimated cost of the chemical cleanup portion of the remedy is \$3.9 million



The Selected Remedy

- Excavation & off-site disposal of soil & sediment above radiological and chemical cleanup levels (Corps is performing radiological cleanup);
- Backfilling open areas with clean fill to grade and/or for wetland replication/restoration needs;
- Connection of two residences to public water supply;
- Ecological pre-design studies;
- Wetland restoration/replication;
- Institutional Controls.



Remedial Design/ Remedial Action

- PRP contractor will perform the nonradiological portion of the remedy
- EPA will oversee the contractor's work
- Excavation activities will not commence until Corps has completed their work
- Other aspects of the remedy will be performed by the PRPs during Corps excavation work



Remedial Design (Initial Phase)

Project Operation Plan

- Prepared to support field work & will include:
 - · Site Management Plan
 - · Sampling and Analysis Plan comprised of:
 - Quality Assurance Project Plan;
 - Field Sampling Plan;
 - Asbestos Management Plan, if needed.
 - · Health and Safety Plan
 - Community Relations Support Plan



Project Operations Plan (cont.)

- Performing defendants will also prepare a Groundwater and Surface Water Monitoring Plan to monitor groundwater and surface water during the Remedial Design and Remedial Action;
- Prior to any sampling, performing defendants must develop a Sampling and Analysis Plan (SAP) and Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP);
- EPA and the Oppmonwealth review and TITA approves plans.



Remedial Design (RD)

- Performing Defendants will develop RD Work Plan that:
 - Provides for the design of the remedy in the ROD and how Performance Standards (cleanup levels) will be met
- EPA and the Commonwealth review the RD Work Plan and EPA approves the RD Work Plan



30% Design

- The 30% Design Submission includes:
 - Results of field investigations and pre-design studies;
 - A discussion of how ARARs are being met by design;
 - Preliminary construction schedule and costs;
 - Institutional Controls Plan



Institutional Controls Plan

- Institutional Controls will be implemented at the Site and at Union Road Houses 1 and 2 and will prohibit the following uses respectively:
 - Residential, agricultural, or other uses at the Site;
 - Construction of structures on the Site with provisions;
 - Extraction of groundwater at the Site and at Union Road Houses 1 and 2;
 - Excavation below the seasonally-high water table at the Site and at Union Road Houses 1 and 2.



100% Design

- Once EPA approves the 30% Design, the Performing Defendants will prepare the 100% Design Submission which:
 - Addresses 100% of the total RD for each component of the Remedial Action, including, but not limited to:
 - Final design plans and specifications;
 - Contingency plan to address on-site workers and local community in the event of an emergency;

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Remedial Action (RA)

- Performing Defendants develop RA Work
 Plan once RD work is complete;
- RA Work Plan:
 - Provides for construction and implementation of the remedy;
 - Achievement of Performance Standards (cleanup levels) in Section L of ROD.
- EPA and the Commonwealth review and EPA approves RD Work Plan



Remedial Action (cont.)

- Operation and Maintenance (O&M) and Environmental Monitoring Plans:
 - Submitted when 75% of construction is complete,
 - O&M Plan includes, but is not limited to:
 - a description of normal maintenance activities;
 - a well maintenance program for wells used during RD/RA activities;
 - a provision for proper abandonment of wells which are unusable or become unusable during RA activities.



Remedial Action (cont.)

- Environmental Monitoring Plan includes, but is not limited to:
 - Monitoring to demonstrate compliance with all Cleanup Levels and Performance Standards;
 - Details how Performing defendants will demonstrate compliance with Cleanup Levels and Performance Standards;



Remedial Action Completion

- Final Remedial Construction and Demonstration of Compliance Report:
 - Submitted upon completion of the RA;
 - Includes all information necessary to demonstrate compliance with the performance standards and cleanup levels;
 - Includes a summary of all procedures used to:
 - excavate the contaminated soil and sediment;
 - dispose of the materials;
 - restore the wetlands:

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Consent Decree Summary

- Performing Defendants finance and perform work;
- Settling Federal Defendant (DOE) provides financing only;
- Owner Settling Defendant (Norton) provides access and institutional controls
